



For a more informal visit you might like to attend one of our wedding shows which happen twice a year – contact us for more information and be sure to follow our Facebook page for our latest news.



Our Georgian King's Room, located within the Mansion House, is licensed for civil ceremonies and can seat up to 100 guests. The King's Room enjoys spectacular views of the surrounding valley and is one of a series of interconnecting rooms which are available exclusively for your day.

The Abbey Lawn area is easily accessible through the adjoining Queen's Room and is the perfect place for guests to enjoy a drinks reception after your ceremony, whilst you are welcome to have photographs taken in our extensive grounds.

For the finishing touches, our package also includes bespoke hand-made wedding stationery (including a table plan, menu cards, table names and place settings), along with flowers of your choosing for the Abbot's Hall. Our dedicated Weddings Co-ordinator is also included in our package, and is available to help with your preparations from start to finish.
